Christmas Eve Report and New Year Invitation

Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

This past Christmas Eve was a beautiful testament to the joy and hope we find in Christ's birth. Over the course of four services, our church welcomed 560 people inperson and another 130 online to worship together and celebrate the coming of Emmanuel, God with us. Each service was a unique expression of worship, filled with music, candlelight, and community.

At 2:30 p.m., we took the Christmas Eve service beyond our walls to the residents of College View Retirement Community. With our incredible organist lending her talent on the piano and members of our choir lifting their voices in song, it was a deeply moving experience. Bringing the joy of Christmas to those who might not have been able to attend otherwise was a beautiful reminder of the heart of our mission: to serve and love our neighbors.

The 5:30 p.m. Family Service was brimming with energy and excitement. With more than 60 children in attendance, the sanctuary was alive with the wonder and joy of the season. From the opening notes of the prelude to the children's laughter during the service, it was a celebration of the Christ child that reminded us all of the beauty of faith through the eyes of a child.

Each of our services featured stunning music that uplifted our hearts and prepared us to receive the message of Christmas. The sacred moment of passing the candlelight during the singing of "Silent Night" was especially meaningful. As the light spread throughout the sanctuary, it symbolized the light of Christ that shines in the darkness, filling us with peace and hope.

As we enter this new year, we invite you to continue worshiping with us as we grow together in faith. We are now in the midst of an eight-week sermon series entitled "Jesus Is Making Waves," a deep dive into the stories of Jesus' life and ministry in the Gospel of Luke. Through these stories, we explore why Jesus' teachings and actions were so transformative in his time and continue to be today.

Two weeks ago, we studied the story in Luke 2 of Jesus' presentation in the temple as an infant, and the impact he made as a 12-year-old child in Jerusalem. Last week we studied the ministry of John the Baptist and how he called the people to "bear fruit

worthy of repentance." We were invited to think about what kind of fruit our own faith is bearing in our lives and in the world. This week we will be studying one of my favorite passages in the Gospel of Luke in chapter 4. It is the start of Jesus' earthly ministry when he walks in to the temple and reads the scroll quoting the prophet Isaiah:

'The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor."

You can join us in worship on Sundays, listen to our weekly podcast, "<u>First Thoughts</u>," or take part in our Tuesday noon Bible study to explore this Gospel and discover how Jesus is still making waves in our lives and world today. Together, let us seek to shine God's light and make waves of love and hope in our community and beyond.


