
#### Studying the Gospel of Luke

Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

Since January we have been doing an in-depth study of the Gospel of Luke in our winter sermon series, Jesus Is Making Waves. It has been a meaningful and thought-provoking journey which tells the story of Jesus of Nazareth from the perspective of a defender of the poor, the weak, and the outcast. It begins with Jesus' humble birth in a stable and ends with his death on a cross and his resurrection from the dead. Luke also contains unique stories, not found in the other Gospels. We meet Jesus as a twelve-year-old boy debating with the teachers in the Temple. Then, Jesus returns to his hometown in Nazareth and reads from the Isaiah scroll declaring his mission of "bringing good news to the poor and freeing the oppressed." (Luke 4) Jesus offers parables of the lost sheep, the lost coin, and the lost son. In this account of Jesus' life, he is a poor traveling teacher who exalts the lowly and brings down the self-inflated. He bucks against his cultural norms and highlights the importance of women, children, outsiders and outcasts. No one is outside of God's love, and all who are lost will be found. Through these stories we have been studying. God seeks the downtrodden and makes sure that everyone has a place at the table. Many in our congregation have shared with me how this deep dive into Luke's account of Jesus' life and ministry has challenged and inspired them. As we move into the season of Lent, we invite you to continue exploring this powerful Gospel with us. Beginning March 16 and continuing through April 13 at 9:15am on Sunday mornings, our Adult Education Forum will provide an opportunity for deeper engagement with Luke's Gospel. Scholar-in-Residence Dr. Dan Deffenbaugh will lead us in further study, helping us uncover the richness of Luke's message.

This year, we are also excited to incorporate a creative new resource into our Lenten study—a graphic novel version of the Gospel of Luke entitled "A Cartoonist's Guide to Luke" written and illustrated by Luther seminary professor Dr. Steve Thomason. If you don't know what a graphic novel is, think of a comic book, but more in-depth. This visually engaging approach brings Luke's narrative to life in a fresh and accessible way. On March 23, Dr. Thomason will join us via

zoom to share his creative process and discuss how visual storytelling can enrich our understanding of scripture. Our high school students will be joining the adult ed forum for this exciting and interesting Lenten study on Sundays during Lent.

We encourage you to make time for this special season of study, reflection, and conversation. Whether you've been following *Jesus Is Making Waves* from the beginning or are just now joining us, there is a place for you in this journey. Come, be part of the story!




#### EVENT DETAILS

Application forms are available in the church office and on the church website.




