Like the original psalm, this paraphrase of Psalm 150 ranges widely through lists of how, why, and where to praise God. Couched in a syncopated gospel style, the setting invites the addition of instruments, though the voices of singers remain most important. It was written by Dr. J. Jefferson Cleveland (1937-1986), one of the most important scholars and editors of African-American congregational songs of the 20th century.






