"The Most Hopeful Image in the World"

Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

This Easter Sunday, the sanctuary at First Presbyterian Church of Hastings rang with joy, light, and celebration as more than 500 people gathered in-person and online for our 8:30 and 10:30 a.m. services. With glorious music led by our amazing organist Linda, the Chancel Choir, and the Cathedral Brass, we proclaimed once again the central hope of our faith: *Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!* 



From the first notes of the prelude to the final "Amen," and the singing of the "Hallelujah Chorus" from Handel's *Messiah*, the worship was filled with the beauty and power of the resurrection story. Brass and organ resounded. Voices lifted in praise. Lilies adorned the sanctuary. And together, we remembered that death does not have the final word.

My sermon, titled "The Most Hopeful Image in the World," drew from the resurrection story in Luke 24 and the soaring promises of Isaiah 40. I shared a childhood memory of watching eagles soar above the ponderosa pines of northern Arizona—free, strong, unshaken. That image of the eagle, long associated with hope and renewal, became a central thread in the message. "Those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength," Isaiah writes. "They will soar on wings like eagles."

But I also acknowledged that hope is not always easy to find. The women at the tomb on that first Easter morning were not expecting resurrection. They were grieving, exhausted, and prepared to anoint Christ's dead body. But instead, they found an empty tomb—and heard the most hope-filled words in all of history: "He is not here. He has risen!"

In that moment, despair turned into testimony. The grief of Friday was answered with the joy of Sunday. And the most hopeful image in the world—a stone rolled away—reminds us that no burden is too great, no valley too deep, no sin too heavy for the God who raised Jesus from the dead.

In my sermon I reminded us: "Resurrection is not simply a metaphor or a feel-good ending tacked onto a tragic story. It is the very real and world-changing declaration that God's love is stronger than death."

So, whether you are weary or joyful, full of faith or just hanging on by a thread—know this: the tomb is empty. Christ is alive. And because he lives, there is always hope.

We are so grateful to all who helped make our Easter worship so meaningful—musicians, ushers, greeters, our tech team, all those behind the scenes, and everyone who joined us to celebrate. I also want to thank Rose Koepp, our Director of Christian Education, who has stepped up while Pastor Damen is out on paternity leave. Rose is taking seminary classes and was able to put what she is learning into practice during Holy Week and Easter and did a great job helping to lead our worship services.

May the hope of the resurrection and the empty tomb continue to lift us in the days ahead, just like eagles on the wind. **Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!**



# JOIN US FOR THE SECOND ANNUAL SACHTLEBEN-THROCKMORTON FAITH AND SCIENCE SYMPOSIUM

Astronaut and Hastings College Alum Clayton Anderson will be joining us at First Presbyterian Church of Hastings on Sunday 4/27 for an exciting conversation, worship service, and free public lecture about the complementary relationship between faith and science.

Anderson graduated cum laude with a Bachelor of Science degree in Physics from Hastings College, Nebraska, in 1981. He had Dr. Sachtleben and Dr. Throckmorton as his professors. He went on to work for NASA as an engineer for 15 years and then became an astronaut for 15 years, going on two space flights, and spending 167 days in space.

Anderson will talk about his time as a scientist and astronaut and how that connects with his faith. "To see God's creation from that vantage point did give me a different perspective. What I really took away from this experience was that my life and all its accomplishments are gifts from God. And viewing Earth from space showed me that none of this is random. My faith was only strengthened by my time in outer space."
