Always Drawing the Welcome Circle Wider: Reflections from Acts 8 & 15

Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

Over the last two weeks, we explored a foundational theme of the early church—how the Holy Spirit constantly pushed the boundaries of belonging, expanding the welcome circle of God’s people. From the wilderness road in Acts 8 to the council chambers in Acts 15, we witnessed a church learning, listening, and ultimately choosing grace over gatekeeping. And through it all, we were reminded of our own call to be a church that is always drawing the welcome circle wider.

On May 11, we heard the remarkable story of Philip and the Ethiopian eunuch—a story that begins not in a synagogue or sanctuary, but on a desert road. There, Philip meets someone who, by every religious and societal standard of the time, did not belong. The Ethiopian eunuch was an outsider’s outsider. And yet, the Holy Spirit led Philip specifically to him, not with answers, but with a question: “Do you understand what you’re reading?” It was a conversation, not a lecture. A shared chariot ride, not a sermon from a distance. And when the eunuch asked, “What is to prevent me from being baptized?” the answer from the Spirit was clear: Nothing.

Then, on May 18, we fast-forwarded to Acts 15 and the Council of Jerusalem—a pivotal moment when the early church had to decide: would Gentile believers be required to meet certain conditions (like circumcision) before they could be fully included? Or could they belong simply by grace? After deep listening and testimony from Peter, Paul, and James, the church came to a bold conclusion: God’s welcome precedes our approval. And the circle was drawn wider still.

These scriptures aren’t just ancient stories; they are blueprints for the church today. They remind us that God’s Spirit leads us not inward toward sameness, but outward toward difference—toward people who’ve been told they don’t belong, toward those on the margins.

Here at First Presbyterian Church, we are striving to live into that call in tangible ways. One of the most vibrant expressions of our welcome is the PEACE Center, where we are practicing radical hospitality every week:

- Through feeding ministries like Hearts and Hands against Hunger, United Harvest, and the Hastings Community Food Pantry, we share food with neighbors near and far and from all walks of life—no questions asked. There is no “us and them” as we seek to feed our hungry neighbors—just us.
- Our community partnerships with the Raices de mi Pueblo folkloric dance troupe and the South Heartland District Health Department continue to serve immigrants, refugees, and neighbors navigating economic or cultural barriers.

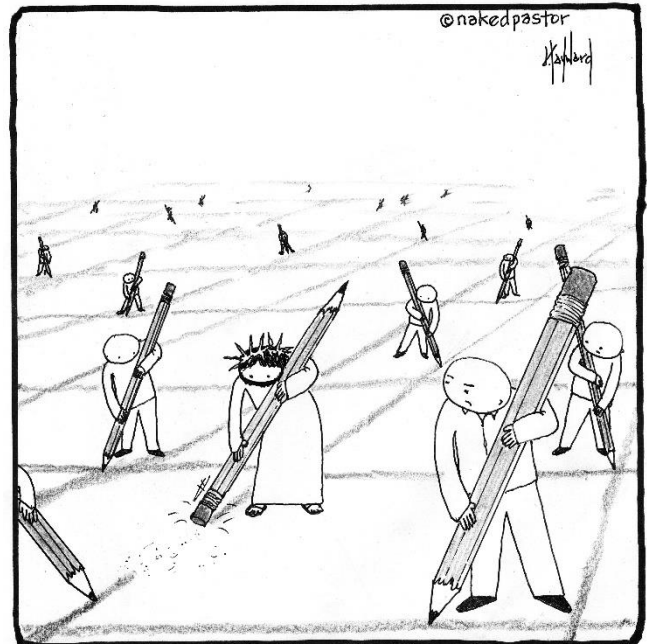

- Our educational partnerships with Central Community College, the Hastings Public Schools Summer Music Program, and more provide we space and welcome to many in the community.
- Every time we open our doors at the PEACE Center or in the church—whether for worship, music, service, or study—we affirm this truth, we are called to draw the welcome circle wider still.

In a polarized world where it's easy to draw lines, Jesus calls us to erase those lines—to extend the table, to expand the invitation, to widen the welcome. I've always loved how this cartoon drawn by Rev. David Hayward, a pastor in Canada, represents the call from Jesus to always invite more people in.

May we, like the early church, be courageous enough to listen deeply, love boldly, and say with joy: There is nothing to prevent you from being part of our community, nothing to stop you from belonging. Nothing to block the grace of God.

Let us be a church that remembers who we are: people welcomed by grace, shaped by love, and sent by the Spirit. Let us be a church that is always—always—drawing the welcome circle wider.

Presbyterian Women Father's Day Offering

Presbyterian Women will be collecting a Father's Day Offering. We will be set up in the Memorial Room on Sundays, May 18, May 25, June 1, and June 15 to take donations. You may donate in honor of a father or in memory of a father. Proceeds will go to Living Waters for the World.

Living Waters for the World (LWW) **trains volunteers** to establish and lead water mission teams that partner with communities to **implement and operate** sustainable water purification systems and health education programs.

[LWW Networks](#) come alongside water teams and partners throughout every phase of a water project. They provide essential support for **sustainable** water systems that produce **clean water for a generation**.

Volunteers are the heart and soul of Living Waters for the World. Unlike organizations that rely on paid staff to initiate and execute water projects, Living Waters for the World relies on volunteer teams trained by volunteer instructors working within volunteer-led networks. LWW's small staff of 3 full-time and 3 part-time employees exists to facilitate the activity and long-term impact of this volunteer force.

Over 2,000 individuals have trained at [Clean Water U](#), and they have engaged an estimated 10,000+ volunteers as members of LWW water teams. Volunteers have also guided the establishment of international networks, the development of Clean Water U's curriculum, and much more!

Volunteers have made LWW what it is today and will play an integral role in ensuring clean water for generations in the communities LWW serves.

The Presbyterian Women would like to thank all of you for your support of our Mother's Day Offering. Every year for Mother's Day, the Presbyterian Women ask for donations for a special group in honor of or in memory of all our mothers. This year we are donating to enCourage. Your Mother's Day offering will help meet the immediate needs of the more than 400 survivors of domestic violence and sexual assault served by enCourage each year. We have recently seen many stories in the news of these women who need help. Through your generosity we have collected \$1,081, to help these victims. Thank you so very much for helping these families.

WHO WE ARE

Café Justo is a coffee grower cooperative in Chiapas, Mexico, that grows, roasts, packages, and ships its own coffee. From seed, to roasting, to exporting, every pound of coffee receives the highest level of quality control.

FOUNDED BY FARMERS

In the 1990s, a 400% drop in international coffee prices forced many farmers to leave their fields to find jobs. Café Justo was founded in 2002 by 26 coffee farming families to address the root causes of migration from our community.



Because Café Justo sales directly benefit the growers and the roasters, members of our cooperatives

need not leave their homes to provide for their families. Our coffee growing families benefit from sustainable wages and environmentally sound growing practices, and they are able to stay together on their lands.

BENEFITS TO FARMERS

Fair Trade is a good start. But it's only a start. Most of the profit in coffee comes from roasting the beans, not growing them. Because Café Justo roasts our own coffee, we can provide our farmer members prices that are higher than Fair Trade prices. Members of Café Justo cooperatives are paid 27.5% of the cost of a pound of retail coffee (and 35.5% of wholesale), roughly three times what growers are typically paid by standard commercial operations.

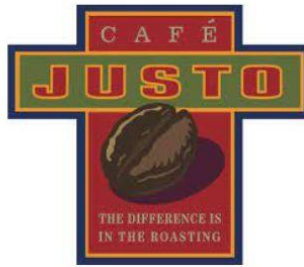
HANDS AROUND THE WORLD STORE

QUALITY ORGANIC COFFEE

High mountain plots. Volcanic soil. Shade-grown plants. Hand-picked, high-quality beans. Delicious blends. Café Justo coffee tastes better because we grow it that way.

We grow our coffee under taller shaded trees because it produces a better bean and nourishes the soil. It's gentler on the land than practices like clear-cutting, which causes erosion, leeches nutrients from the soil, and does irreparable damage. We do everything we can to protect the environment. Our coffee farms provide habitats for birds and wildlife. The soil's low acidic content results in delicious coffee.

Arabica beans are delicate, aromatic, and flavorful. But if you like an extra-caffeinated kick, try Robusto. And for those who prefer less octane, our water processed decaf is the perfect choice. Choose the bean or blend that's right for you.

DIRECT RELATIONSHIPS

By retaining the value -added in our communities, we have been able to help revitalize our community, bring our families back together, and see our children and grandchildren go on to higher education. The majority of our founders were in their 50s, 60s, and 70s when they founded the cooperative with the hopes that their children could return home to raise their families. Indeed, many of those children have returned, and many of the founders have been able to retire, knowing their land and your coffee are in good hands.

We are grateful to have been joined by partner churches, farmers markets, universities, and small businesses across the United States that are striving to make a positive impact on both sides of the border.



Our commitment adds up to more than dollars or pesos. It adds up to strong futures.

All of the growers and employees of Café Justo cooperatives receive medical benefits and a pension plan. Café Justo also provides coffee to all families in the community for 3 days following a death in a coffee growing family.

Profits from Café Justo support migrant shelters and drug rehabilitation centers, as well as community development projects, both in Chiapas where the coffee is grown, and in Agua Prieta where the coffee is roasted, packaged, and shipped.
