Why Sunday Morning Still Matters—Even in Summer

Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

As the sun stays out longer and summer vacations beckon, it's easy to slip into a rhythm where Sunday mornings feel like just another chance to sleep in, work in the garden, or to head out on a weekend getaway. And while rest and recreation are important (God, after all, created both Sabbath and summer!), our Presbyterian tradition reminds us that worshiping together each Sunday is not just a habit—it's a vital part of our faith.

At its heart, Sunday worship is not about obligation, but about *invitation*. Each week, God calls us to gather—to hear the Word, to lift our voices in song, to pray for the world and for one another, and to be renewed in grace. Church isn't just something we go to; it's something we do together. We gather together in fellowship as the body of Christ. In Reformed theology, we are *formed by* worship, shaped over time by showing up and participating in the rhythm of God's story.

So even as your summer fills with travel and outdoor adventures, we hope you'll make time for the holy rhythm of Sunday morning worship. And to make it even more special, we're excited to offer a series of musical gifts each weekend for the next five weeks—read on for more details!

Saturday, June 7 at 7pm: A free concert in the Sanctuary with artist Daniel Christian. He is a former English teacher who is a storyteller and a singer-songwriter. Sunday, June 8 at 10:30am: Pentecost Sunday! Join us in the sanctuary for a meaningful Pentecost Sunday worship. This promises to be meaningful morning of worship, and don't forget to wear red!

Sunday, June 22 at 10:30am: Vacation Bible School preview! Our own Hannah Jensen-Heitmann is writing original music for Vacation Bible School this year. She will share her new songs and teach them to the congregation as part of this very special worship service.

Sunday, June 29 at 10:30am: Campfire Folk Sunday! The band that is headlining *Flatwater Music Festival* on Saturday night will be joining us on Sunday morning to help lead worship. The band is called *A Brother's Fountain* and is out of Fort Collins, Colorado. They write, "We believe that music is the great connector, the great equalizer, and a powerful healing force we all need to feel hope, joy, and connection." They bring a "campfire folk" sound with songs that range from big and upbeat to reflective, laid-back sing-alongs. We hope you'll join us for these joyful and spirit-filled Sundays. Come as you are, bring a friend, and let the music, the message, and the fellowship renew your soul.





father or in memory of a father. Proceeds will go to Living Waters for the World.

Living Waters for the World (LWW) **trains volunteers** to establish and lead water mission teams that partner with communities to **implement and operate** sustainable water purification systems and health education programs.

<u>LWW Networks</u> come alongside water teams and partners throughout every phase of a water project. They provide essential support for **sustainable** water systems that produce **clean water for a generation**.

Volunteers are the heart and soul of Living Waters for the World. Unlike organizations that rely on paid staff to initiate and execute water projects, Living Waters for the World relies on volunteer teams trained by volunteer instructors working within volunteer-led networks. LWW's small staff of 3 full-time and 3 part-time employees exists to facilitate the activity and long-term impact of this volunteer force.

Over 2,000 individuals have trained at <u>Clean Water U</u>, and they have engaged an estimated 10,000+ volunteers as members of LWW water teams. Volunteers have also guided the establishment of international networks, the development of Clean Water U's curriculum, and much more!

Volunteers have made LWW what it is today and will play an integral role in ensuring clean water for generations in the communities LWW serves.
