
Job's Trials: A Jazz Concert – Thursday, September 25 at 7:30pm

Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

Over the last few weeks, our worship and adult education series has taken us deep into the story of Job. Together we have wrestled with the age-old questions: Why do bad things happen to good people? Where is God when we suffer? What does it mean to hold fast to faith when life feels unfair?

Now, we have the privilege of continuing this journey in a new way: through music. On **Thursday**, **September 25 at 7:30pm in our sanctuary**, we will host *Job's Trials: A Jazz Song Cycle* by bassist and composer **Dan Loomis**. Following the concert, we will have a conversation with Dan Loomis and our scholar-inresidence, Dr. Dan Deffenbaugh. The event is free and open to the public.

This evocative work brings the ancient story of Job to life in a fresh and powerful way. Loomis has created a new kind of jazz song cycle, blending soulful bass, daring improvisation, rich choral textures, and theatrical narration. Each movement explores a theme from Job's story: the injustice of suffering, the righteousness of



rebellion, the fleeting value of virtue. At the center stands Job himself, daring to demand that God be held to account. Through the language of jazz and blues, Loomis illuminates both the despair and the hope of Job's journey.

Some of you may remember Dan from his visit to our church in October 2023 with the Theodicy Jazz Collective, which included our own Ann Phelps. After that concert, Dan shared with me that he was working on a major new project: setting the book of Job to jazz. He asked if we might be interested in hosting it when it was ready. Two years later, we are honored to be one of the first churches to present this bold and inspiring work.

series is supported by the legacy of Luella Langenberg, who gave generously to support special music at First Presbyterian Church. Through her vision and generosity, and the faithful stewardship of our Worship, Arts, and Music Committee and Session, we are able to offer concerts like this free of charge to the entire Hastings community.

I encourage you to come and to invite a friend, neighbor, or colleague to join you. This promises to be an unforgettable evening where faith, art, and music intersect; an evening that will challenge us, move us, and perhaps even transform us as we hear Job's story told in a new voice.




If you'd like to bring your pet, please do! But please keep it on a leash or in a carrier. You could also bring a picture of your pet.

SUPPLIES NEEDED:

- One five-gallon bucket with resealable lid (If reused, please scrub clean. Do not use a bucket that has held chemicals of any kind. Brand labels on the outside are acceptable)
- Five scouring pads (No stainless steel or pads with soap in them. Remove from packaging)
- Seven sponges, including one large
- One scrub brush (With or without handle)
- 18 reusable, lightweight multipurpose cleaning towels (Not paper towels. Remove from packaging) N. 1761 E 2.95.
- One 16-34oz bottle of liquid dish soap (antibacterial preferred)
- One 12-40oz bottle of liquid concentrate household cleaner that can be mixed with water (No spray bottles)
- One 50-100 ft clothesline (Cotton or plastic line)
- Five dust masks (N95 particulate respirator dust masks preferred; No surgical masks)
- Two pairs of heavy-duty, waterproof dishwashing gloves (Latex-free preferred. Durable for multiple use. Remove from packaging)
- One pair of heavy-duty, reusable work gloves (Such as Nitrile, cotton with leather palm, or all leather)
- 20-28 heavy-duty or contractor-type 30-45 gallon trash bags on a roll (Remove from packaging)

All cleaning items must be new and all liquid items must be capped and securely tightened. Place all items into the bucket, making sure they are packed securely to avoid damage during shipment. Snap the lid on tight and seal with packing tape.
