Faithful Foundations: Listening, Aligning, and Building Together

Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

Two weeks ago, we began our annual journey of stewardship with a reminder from Exodus 16 that **stewardship begins with trust**; trust in God's daily provision and trust that God will continue to provide for the future of our lives and our church. As we have continued through our series *Faithful Foundations: Trusting, Listening, Aligning, Building*, we have reflected each week on how stewardship is far more than a financial exercise. It is a spiritual practice. It is discipleship. It is how we say "thank you" to God with our lives.

In week two, we moved from **Trusting to Listening** with the story of young Samuel, who prayed, "Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening." Samuel reminds us that stewardship is not just about giving, it is about listening for God's call and asking how God wants us to use the gifts we've been given. When each of us listens deeply, we discover that God is always inviting us to respond with generosity, compassion, and courage.

In week three, we reflected on **Aligning our hearts with God's purposes**. When the prophet Samuel looked at Jesse's sons, he was drawn to those who appeared strong and capable. But God chose David, someone everyone else had overlooked because, as Scripture tells us, *"the Lord looks on the heart."* When it comes to stewardship, God is not measuring the size of our bank accounts but the intention of our hearts. We are called not to equal gifts, but to equal sacrifice; each of us giving faithfully in a way that aligns our resources with God's vision for this community.

Now, as we enter the final week of our stewardship journey, we turn to the theme of **Building**. Like Solomon, who built the temple as a lasting witness to God's presence, we are called to build something that will bless generations to come: a church rooted in worship, mission, hospitality, and hope. God has given us strong foundations through the faithfulness of those who came before us, and now it is our turn to build.

A Practical Word About Stewardship at FPC Hastings

As we prepare for **Commitment Sunday on October 26**, I want to speak plainly about how our church is funded and why your pledge matters.

First Presbyterian Church of Hastings does not receive financial support from our national denomination. **Every dollar that funds our ministry comes from our members and friends.** Your pledges provide:

• Our staff, who shepherd, teach, lead, care, and serve with faith and excellence. Our staff is the largest part of our budget because ministry is about people, and we are blessed with an extraordinary team. This year, we are facing a 10% increase in health insurance costs, and we want to care for our staff as they care for us.

• **Our facilities**, including our historic church building and the PEACE Center. These spaces are not financial burdens; they are tools for ministry. They allow us to worship God, make music, gather children and youth, host funerals and weddings, offer classes and mission projects, distribute food, welcome immigrant families, and serve the community in Christ's name. Yet with over 50,000 square feet to maintain and insurance costs rising more than 10%, caring for these buildings requires faithful generosity.

This year, we are prayerfully asking every household to **consider increasing their pledge** from last year. As our church continues to grow and expand its ministry impact, your gifts ensure we move boldly into the future God is shaping among us.

Commitment Sunday - October 26

Next Sunday will be Commitment Sunday, when we will bring forward our pledge cards during worship and dedicate them to God. On the back of your pledge card and below, you will find a stewardship prayer. 

Dedication of the Prayer Garden Columbarium & Memorial Wall is planned for All Saints Sunday November 2nd.


