Daily Bread, Daily Trust: Kicking Off Our Stewardship Season

Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

This October, we begin a journey together as a church family: a journey of faith, trust, and generosity. Stewardship is often associated with pledge cards and budgets, and yes, in the coming weeks you'll receive a letter and pledge card in the mail. But at its heart, stewardship is much more than numbers on a page. It is a way of life, rooted in the conviction that everything we have comes from God and that we are called to respond with gratitude.

On **Sunday, October 5,** I preached from Exodus 16, where God's people in the wilderness worried about their next meal. In their hunger and fear, God provided manna; bread from heaven, enough for each day. They couldn't hoard it or stockpile it; they had to trust God for daily bread, one day at a time.

That lesson is as true for us as it was for the Israelites: **stewardship begins with trust in God's provision.** When we trust God to provide, we can live more open-handedly, generously, and joyfully. And when we see someone else who is experiencing a season of wilderness wandering, we are invited to become manna for them: God's provision through our love, presence, and gifts.

I've seen this truth come alive in my own family. After my dad died in a tragic accident five years ago, my mom entered a season that could only be described as wilderness. She was overwhelmed with grief, but also with the practical matters of daily life that my dad had always handled: finances, home repairs, even mowing the lawn. Living six hours away, I couldn't always be there for her as much as I wanted. She told me one day that she prayed desperately, "Lord, I don't even know how to survive this. How will I make it through tomorrow?"

One of the things she had to do was winterize their RV, and she had no idea how to do that. She posted a note in the RV group that my parents had belonged to, and that very afternoon someone showed up at her door with a toolbox. He fixed what she needed and told her he'd be back to check in. Week after week, people kept showing up: sometimes with tools, sometimes with a casserole, sometimes just to sit and have coffee. Neighbors, church family, and friends became God's manna for her. It wasn't flashy. It wasn't everything she thought she wanted. But it was exactly what she needed: daily bread, daily trust. As she said, "I didn't know how I was going to get through. But God kept sending me what I needed, when I needed it."

Friends, that's stewardship in real life—not about how much money you have, but about trusting that God will provide and being willing to be God's provision for someone else. We are called to

both trust that God will provide for us, and we are called to provide for others. One way we can do that is by giving generously to the church to support the work we are doing as we seek to provide for our community.

This year's stewardship theme is **Faithful Foundations: Trusting, Listening, Aligning, Building.** Over four Sundays, we will reflect on how God calls us to be faithful stewards—not only of money, but of our time, gifts, and lives:

- October 5 Daily Bread, Daily Trust: Trusting (Exodus 16:1–18) Stewardship begins with trust in God's daily provision.
- October 12 Speak, Lord: Listening (1 Samuel 3:1–21) Stewardship involves attentiveness to God's call on our lives and resources.
- October 19 The Heart of the Matter: Aligning (1 Samuel 16:1–13) Stewardship is aligning our hearts and gifts with God's vision.
- October 26 A House for God: Building (1 Kings 5:1–5; 8:1–13) Stewardship means building together for God's glory and the generations to come.

Our journey will culminate on **Commitment Sunday, October 26**, when we will dedicate our pledge cards and our lives anew to God's work through this church.

As we step into this season, I invite you to begin each day with gratitude: "Lord, thank you for today's bread." Trust God to provide what you need. And prayerfully consider how your gifts of money, time, and talents can be manna for someone else.

Together, we will discover again that God's grace is enough, Christ's table is wide enough, and the Spirit's abundance is more than enough to sustain us for the journey ahead.



- If you would like to volunteer for this distribution, please come to the church at 9:30am to help us with the distribution.












CROP HUNGER WALK



Stop Hunger and Honor Frank Medsker


October 12, 2025 @ 2:00 pm Lake Hastings, Hastings, NE

SUPPLIES NEEDED:

- One five-gallon bucket with resealable lid (If reused, please scrub clean. Do not use a bucket that has held chemicals of any kind. Brand labels on the outside are acceptable)
- Five scouring pads (No stainless steel or pads with soap in them. Remove from packaging)
- Seven sponges, including one large
- One scrub brush (With or without handle)
- 18 reusable, lightweight multipurpose cleaning towels (Not paper towels. Remove from packaging)
- One 16-34oz bottle of liquid dish soap (antibacterial preferred)
- One 12-40oz bottle of liquid concentrate household cleaner that can be mixed with water (No spray bottles)
- One 50-100 ft clothesline (Cotton or plastic line)
- Five dust masks (N95 particulate respirator dust masks preferred; No surgical masks)
- Two pairs of heavy-duty, waterproof dishwashing gloves (Latex-free preferred. Durable for multiple use. Remove from packaging)
- One pair of heavy-duty, reusable work gloves (Such as Nitrile, cotton with leather palm, or all leather)
- 20-28 heavy-duty or contractor-type 30-45 gallon trash bags on a roll (Remove from packaging)

All cleaning items must be new and all liquid items must be capped and securely tightened. Place all items into the bucket, making sure they are packed securely to avoid damage during shipment. Snap the lid on tight and seal with packing tape.
