Seeing the Gospel: Welcoming “The Art Pastor,” Dr. Steve Thomason


Sometimes the best way to *hear* the Gospel is to *see* it.

This weekend we have a special guest joining us at First Presbyterian Church of Hastings who helps people do exactly that. Dr. Steve Thomason, known as “The Art Pastor,” will be with us for a full weekend of learning, creativity, and worship.

Dr. Thomason is an associate professor of Spiritual Formation and Discipleship at Luther Seminary. He describes himself as a post-Evangelical, missional, neo-Lutheran theologian, rostered in the ELCA, and an artist. More simply put, he is someone who loves God deeply and has dedicated his life to helping others grow in faith through both words *and* images. He has created graphic-novel style renderings of numerous books of the Bible and regularly develops visual, innovative, and educational resources for the church. His work explores spiritual formation, biblical studies, theology, and art in ways that are accessible, thoughtful, and often surprisingly moving.

We are excited that his time with us will span several settings in our community:

- **Friday:** Dr. Thomason will present to two Hastings College art classes, engaging students in conversation about creativity and visual storytelling.
- **Saturday:** He will record a podcast conversation with Pastor Damen about art, theology, and the life of the church.
- **Sunday Morning Adult Education Forum:** Dr. Thomason will offer an *Introduction to the Gospel of John*, using both teaching and visual art to illuminate the themes of light, revelation, and transformation that run throughout John’s Gospel.
- **Sunday Worship:** Dr. Thomason will preach and share his artwork, focusing on *John 4:46 – 5:18*, inviting us to encounter Scripture not only through hearing but also through seeing.

For many of us, faith has long been shaped by sermons, hymns, and study. Dr. Thomason reminds us that images can also be a doorway into deeper understanding. His art does not replace Scripture; rather, it opens fresh angles of reflection, helping us notice details, emotions, and connections we might otherwise miss. In a season when we are walking through the Gospel of John together, his presence feels especially timely.

Whether you are an artist, a lifelong Bible student, or simply someone curious about new ways of engaging faith, this weekend offers a unique opportunity. Come to the adult education forum to explore the big picture of John's Gospel, and then join us in worship as we experience Scripture proclaimed through both word and image.



